4. Read Jonah 4:1-5 and answer the following questions:
 - a. Why was Jonah so angry that he wanted the Lord to take away his life?

 - b. What do you make of God's question to Jonah in verses 4, "Is it right for you to be angry?"

 - c. When Jonah goes and sits east of the city in verse 5, what do you think he was waiting for?

5. Read Jonah 4:6-11 and answer the following questions:
 - a. What lesson do you think the Lord taught Jonah through the vine, worm and wind?

 - b. How does the statement, "Salvation comes from the Lord" ring true in the Book of Jonah?

 - c. What does this story tell us about the nature of God's love?
